The last 12 months have forced many of us into survival mode: thriving communities like our own have been cut back to the bone, forcing us to ask what it is within our capacity to do, and if this is enough to serve our community and fulfill our mandate.

And yet this situation has also prompted us to envision new ways to reach our community, ways that are important and necessary outside the scope of a global pandemic. We now have the tools to enable the participation of those who live outside of Montreal, who winter outside of Montreal, or who cannot traverse the goat paths that pass for sidewalks in the wintertime in this city. We can address these perennial access issues in ways we had not considered in the "beforetimes."

The pandemic has pushed us to do what we do best: to see a gap in access to education and to fill that gap. Our 76-year history consists of delivering education programming to groups for whom the traditional format and institutions do not work: lifelong learners, incarcerated persons, seniors in residences. We are proud to add our snowbirds and community members with mobility constraints to that list.


